A Word from the District Manager ...

Dear Community Board 8 Resident:

The Community Board 's Transportation Committee has been inundated with requests for speed bumps within our district. In addition to having buyer's remorse whereby residents change their minds once the speed bumps have been installed, the members wanted the community to be aware of the following negatives associated with the installation of speed bumps:

- Speed bumps cost between \$4,500 to \$7,500 each to install.
- They interfere with response times for emergency vehicles.
- They reduce property values. Prospective buyers reject homes on streets where speed bumps are located.
- They increase the noise level with each passing vehicle.
- They increase wear and tear on vehicles.
- Once installed they are expensive to remove.
- They increase air pollution:
 - Carbon Dioxide by 82%
 - Carbon Monoxide by 50%
 - Nitrogen Oxide by 37%
- They reduce fuel efficiency and increase gas consumption.
- In addition, studies show that the installation of speed bumps do not change driver behaviors.

- Residents who normally receive Monday **garbage** and **organics** collection should place their trash and organic materials out at curbside after 4 p.m. on Monday, October 10th for pickup.
- Residents receiving Monday **recycling** collection should place their items curbside, after 4 p.m. on Sunday, October 16th for pickup on Monday, October 17th.

The Department clears litter, snow and ice from approximately 6,500 miles of City streets and removes debris from vacant lots as well as abandoned vehicles from City streets.

November 1st - December 15th and January 2nd - February 9th. Mondays through Thursdays from 5:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.



Did you know???



The NYC Department of Finance mailed SCHE and DHE renewal letters to homeowners who currently receive these property tax exemptions. By law, recipients of the SCHE are required to renew every two years and DHE recipients are required to renew every year.


The deadline to renew to continue receiving these exemptions will be on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>March 15</u>, <u>2017</u>. Please do not wait until the last minute to send in your renewal application. You may use your income from 2015 if the 2016 income is not yet available.

Did you know that nearly 16% of low-income New Yorkers report eating no fruits or vegetables a day?

According to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, one barrier to eating more fruits and vegetables is cost.

There is a great resource for residents who receive Supplemental

Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits called **Health Bucks**. They are coupons redeemable for \$2 worth of fresh fruits and vegetables at all NYC farmers' markets. Customers will receive \$2 Health Bucks coupons for every \$5 they spend using SNAP



Starting this year, Health Bucks will be available year-round to SNAP recipients shopping at farmers' markets!
