


I. Population Change: Total Population in DOC Custody


Total DOC Population by Custody Status January 22, 2022 – January 28, 2022


City Sentenced Population by Custody Status January 22, 2022 – January 28, 2022





Number and Percent of Patients Ever Confirmed Positive for COVID-19 While in Custody January 22 – January 28, 2022












Number of People in Confirmed/Symptomatic Housing March 16, 2020 – January 28, 2022


Number and Percent of Open Units Above and Below 50% Capacity by Housing Category January 27, 2022
