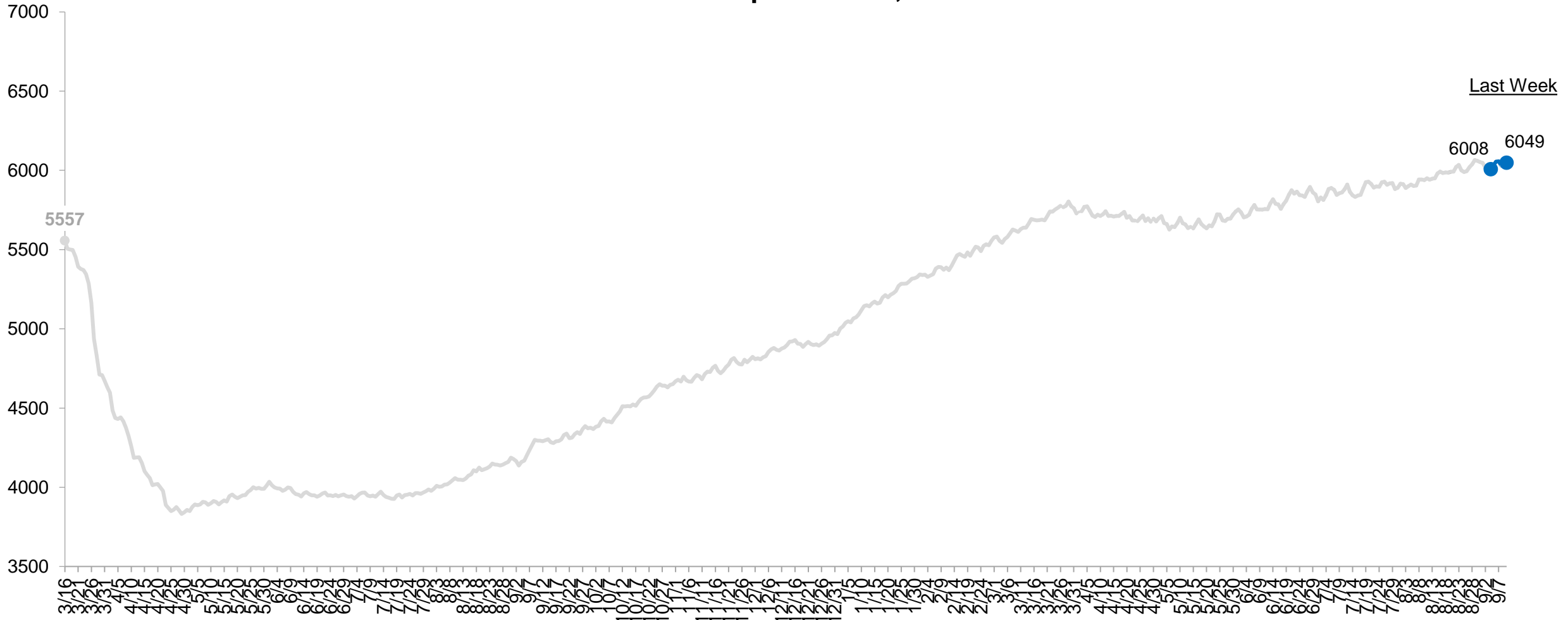

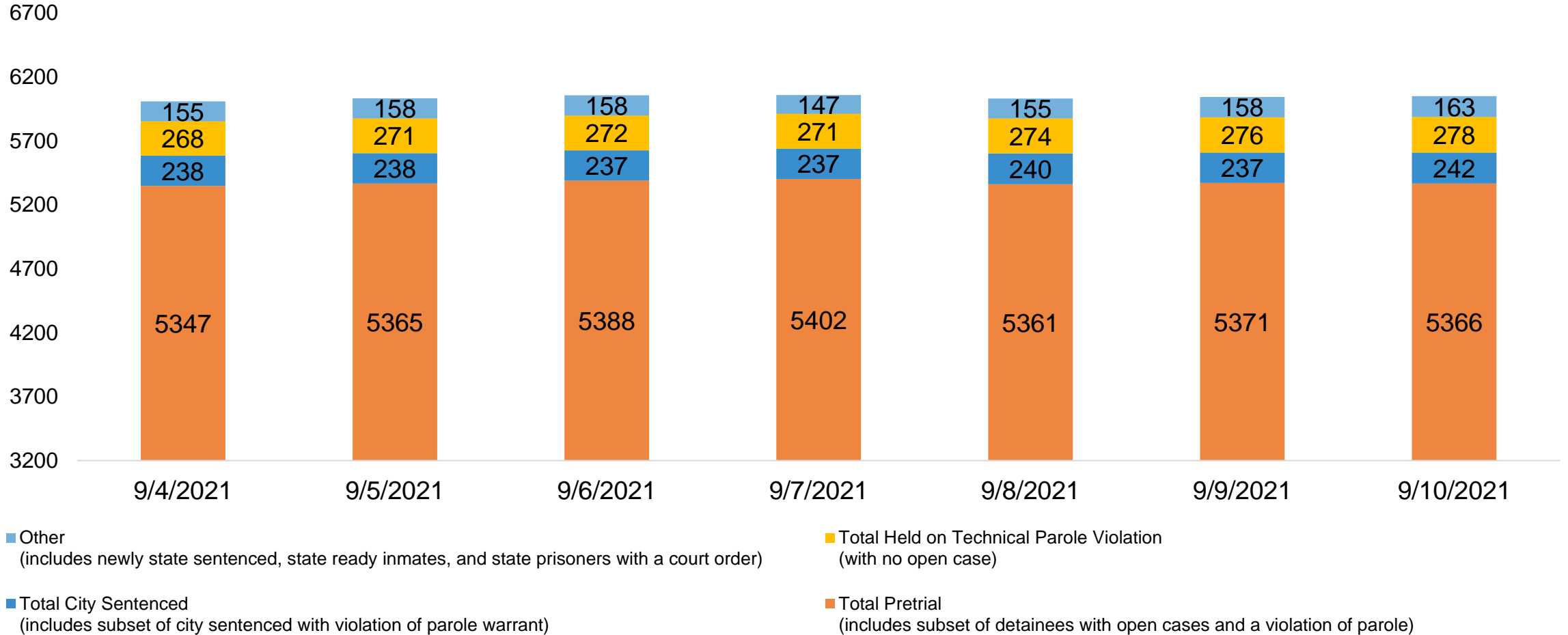
## Total Population in DOC Custody March 16 – September 10, 2021

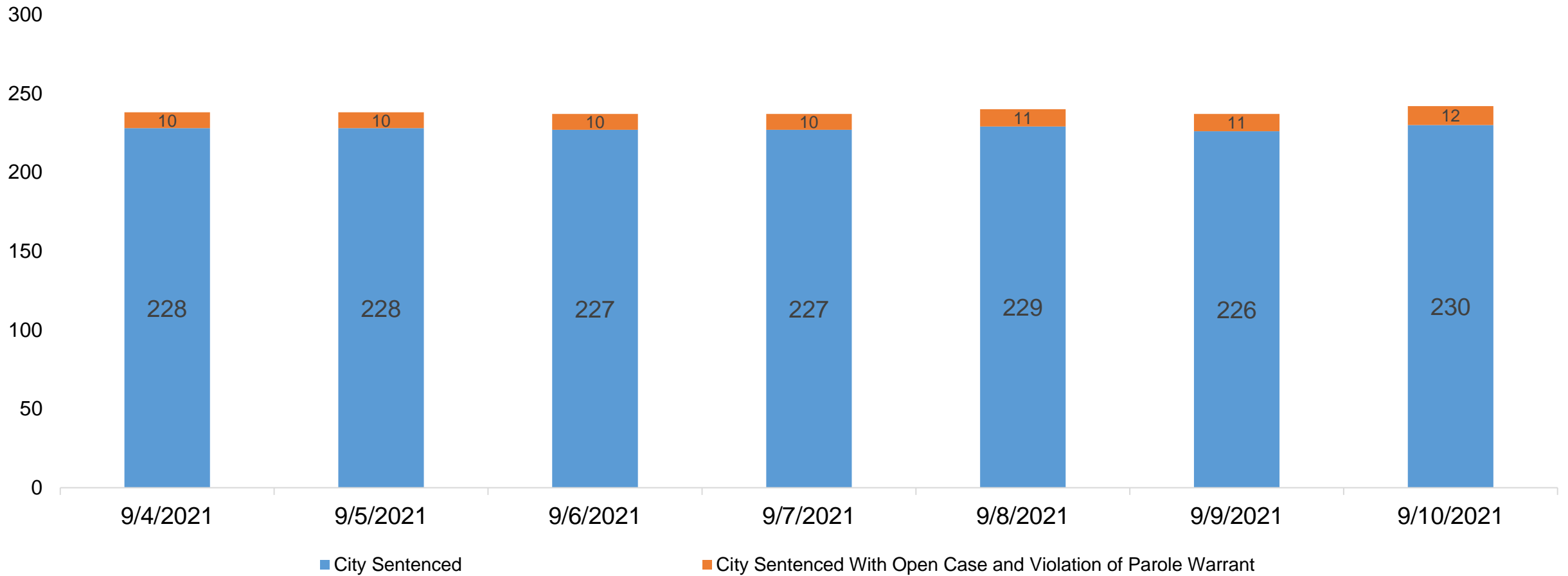

## Total DOC Population by Custody Status, 9/4/2021 - 9/10/2021



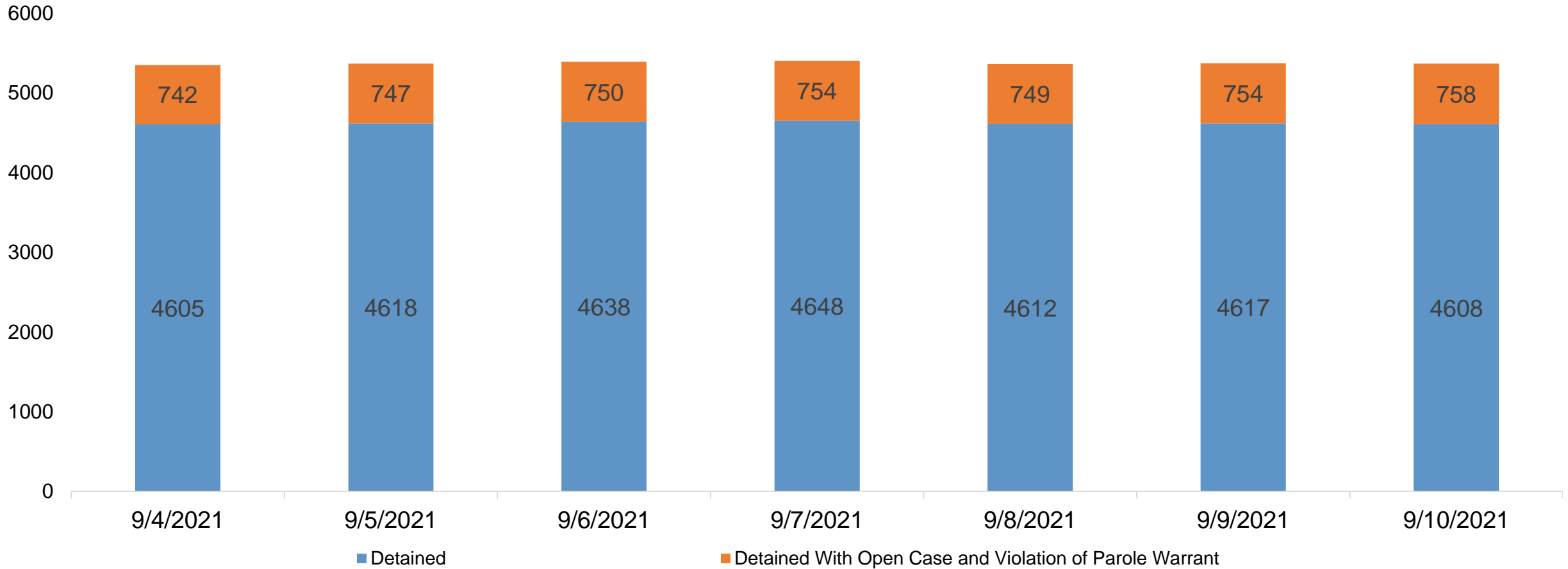

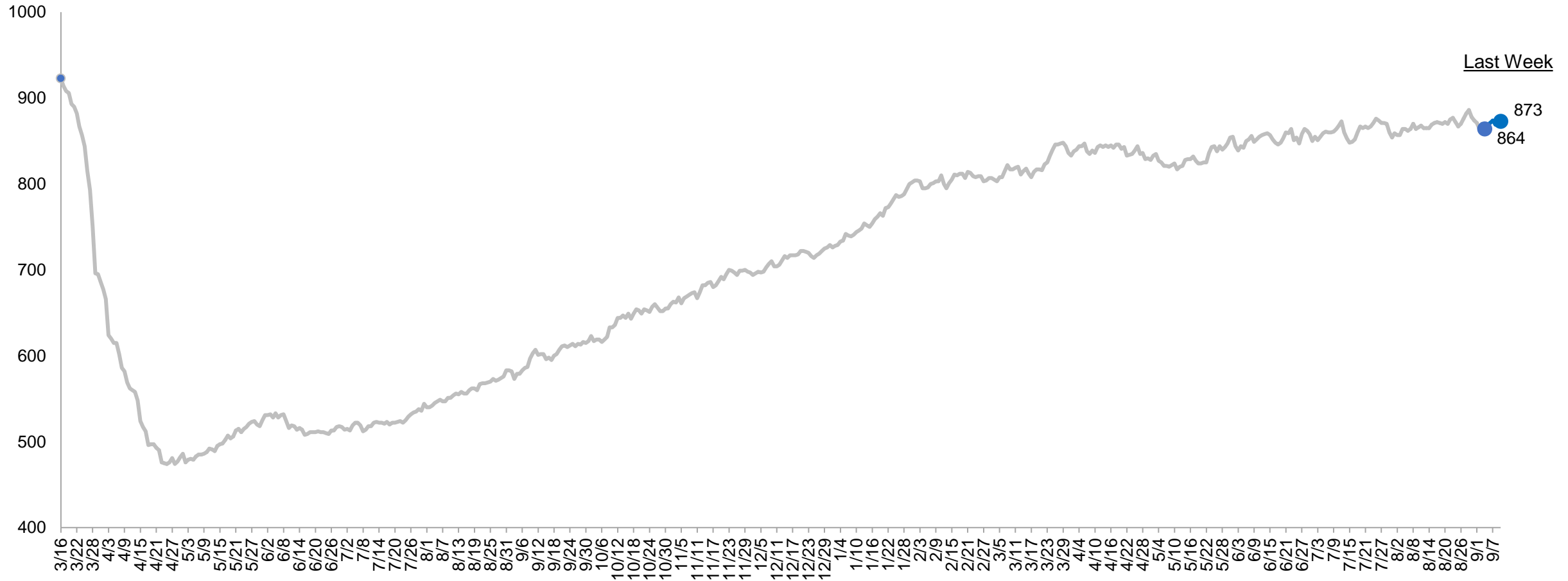

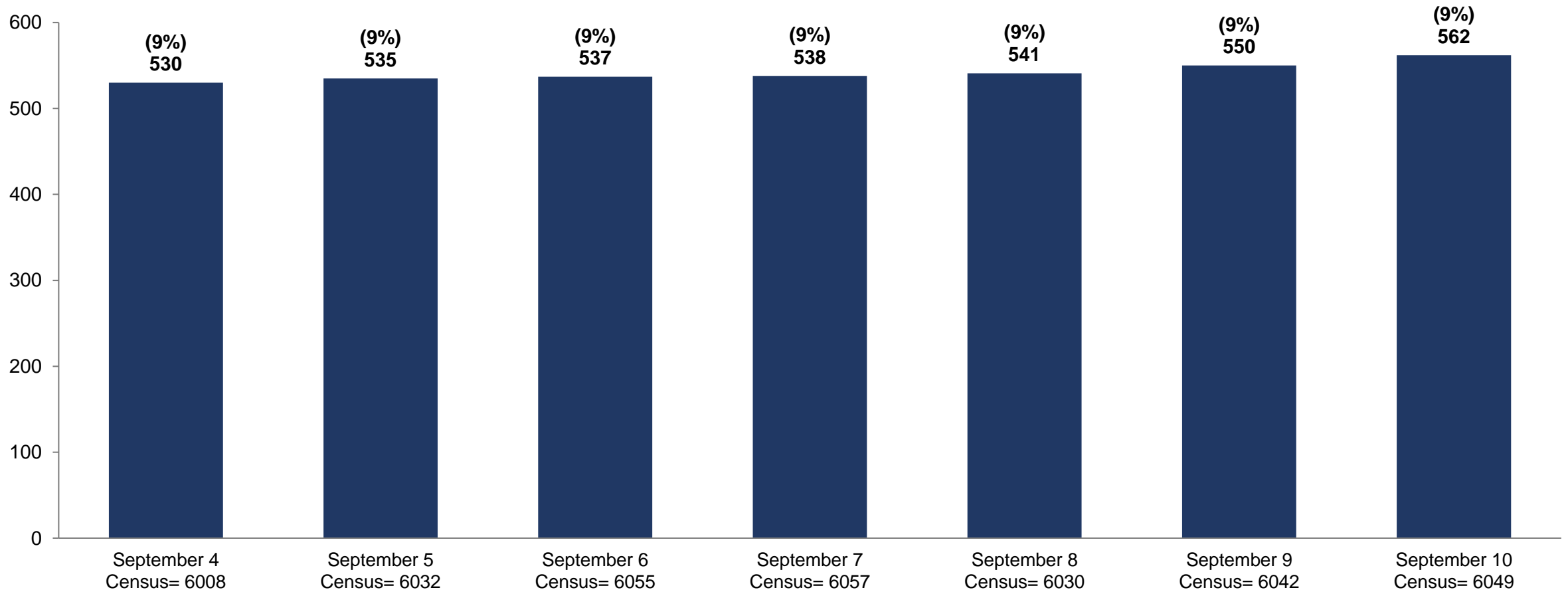

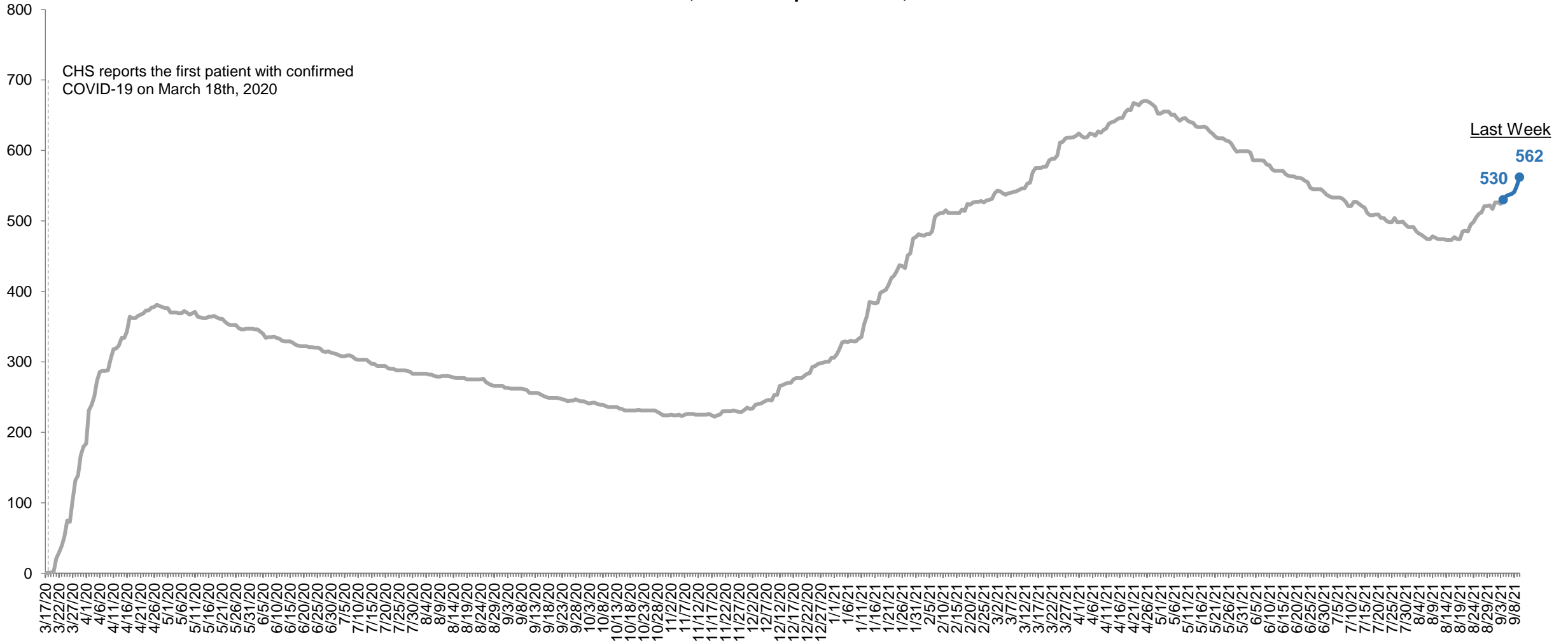
Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19

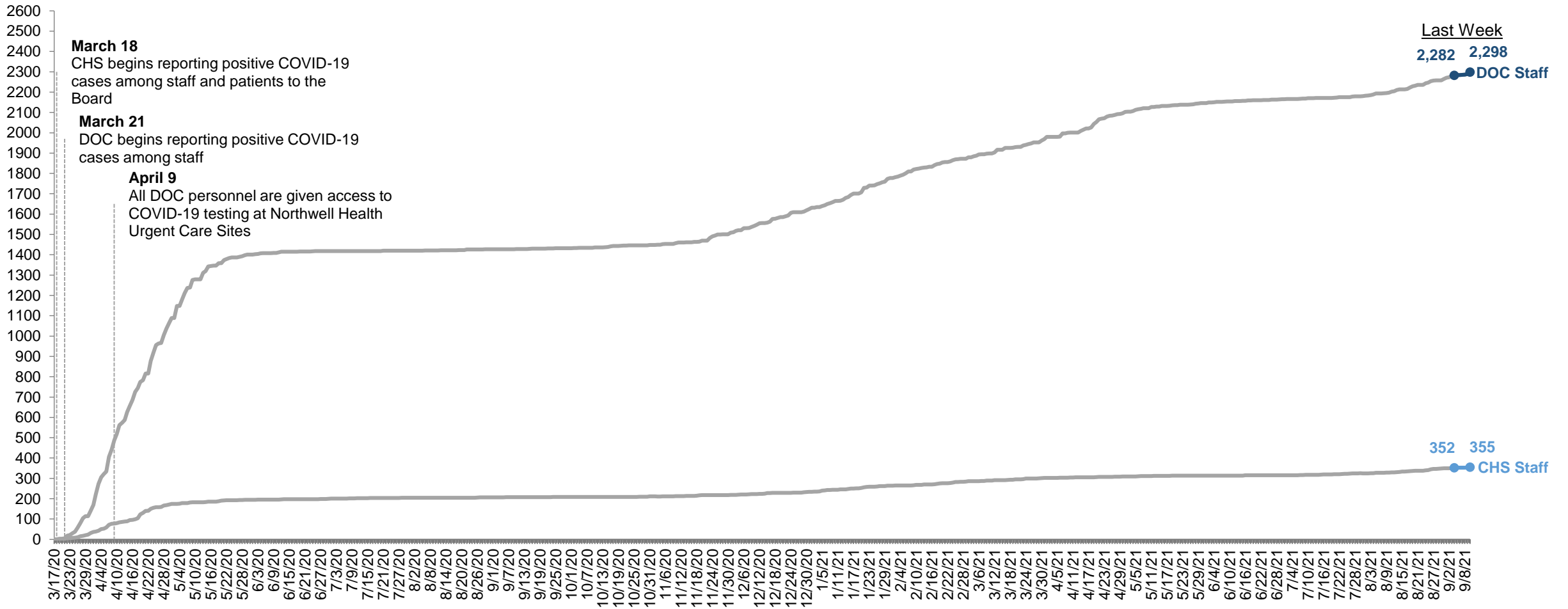

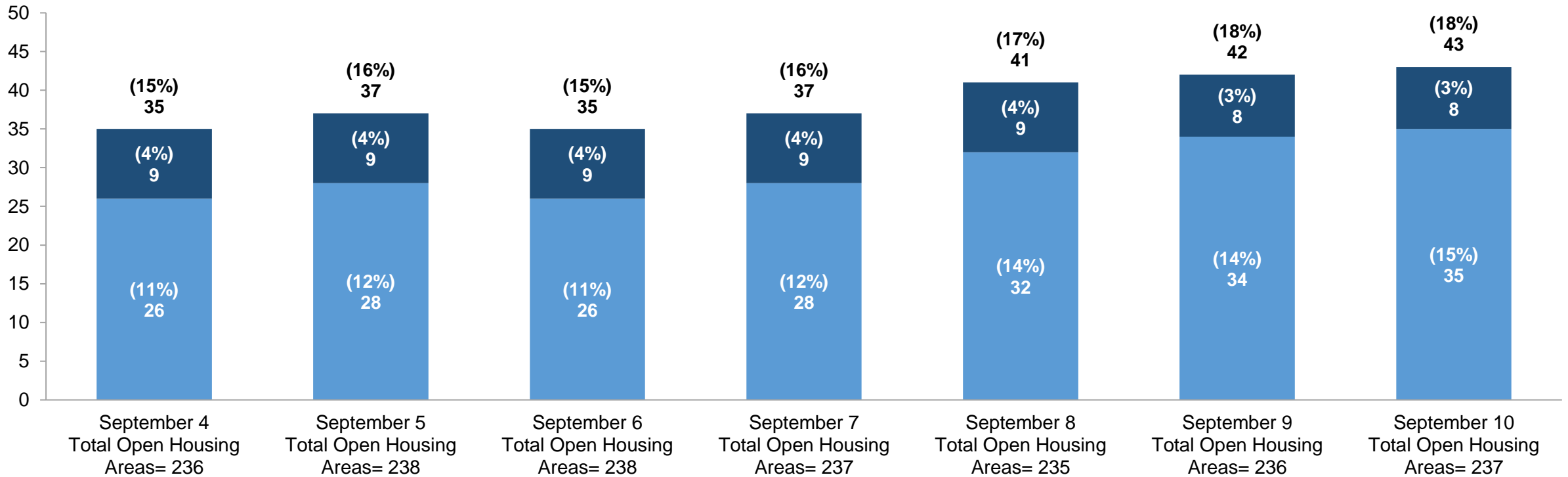

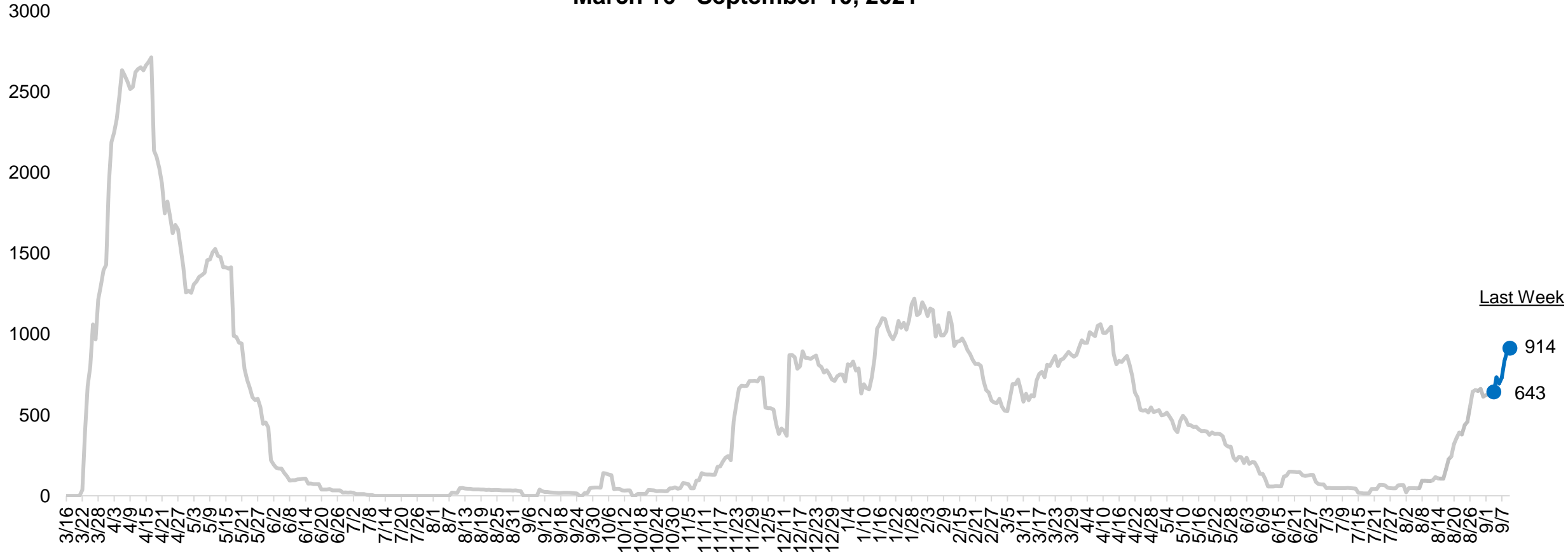

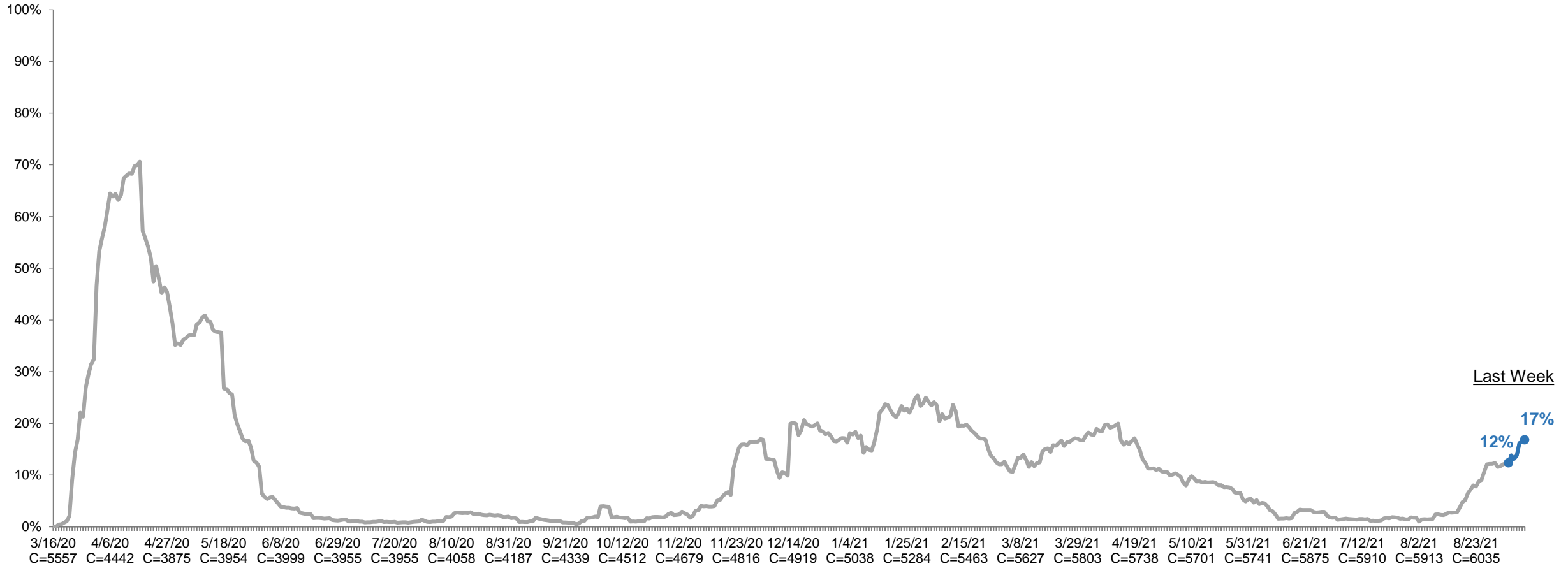

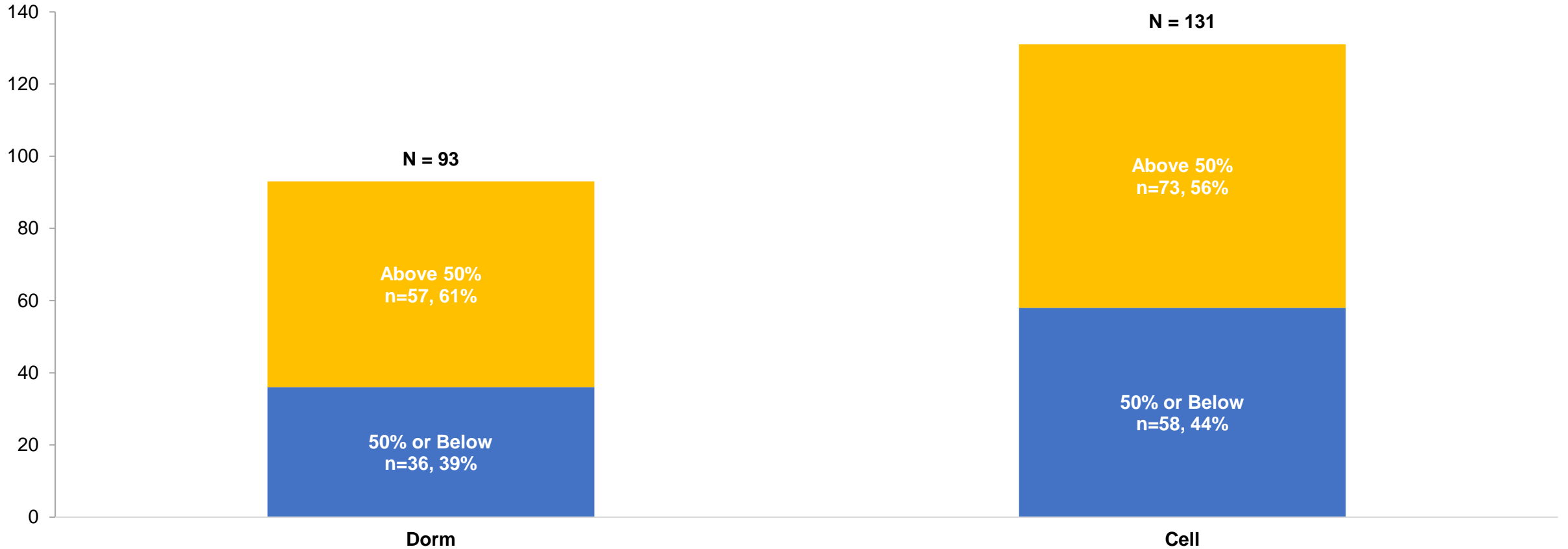

September 9, 2021



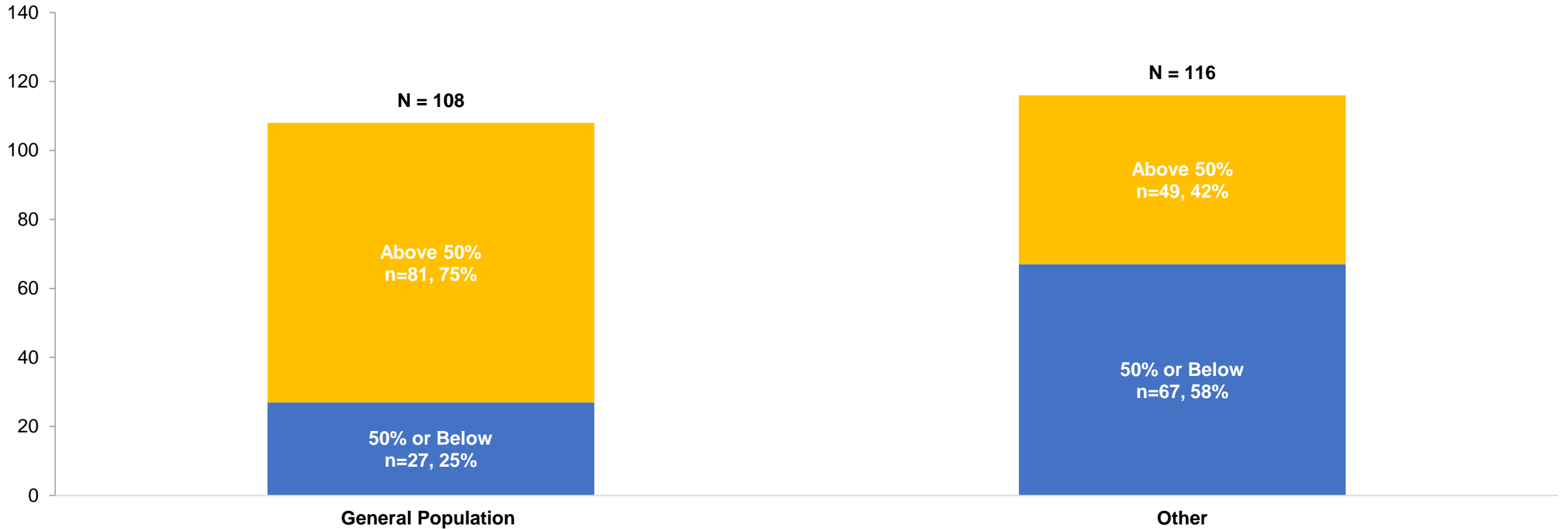

September 9, 2021



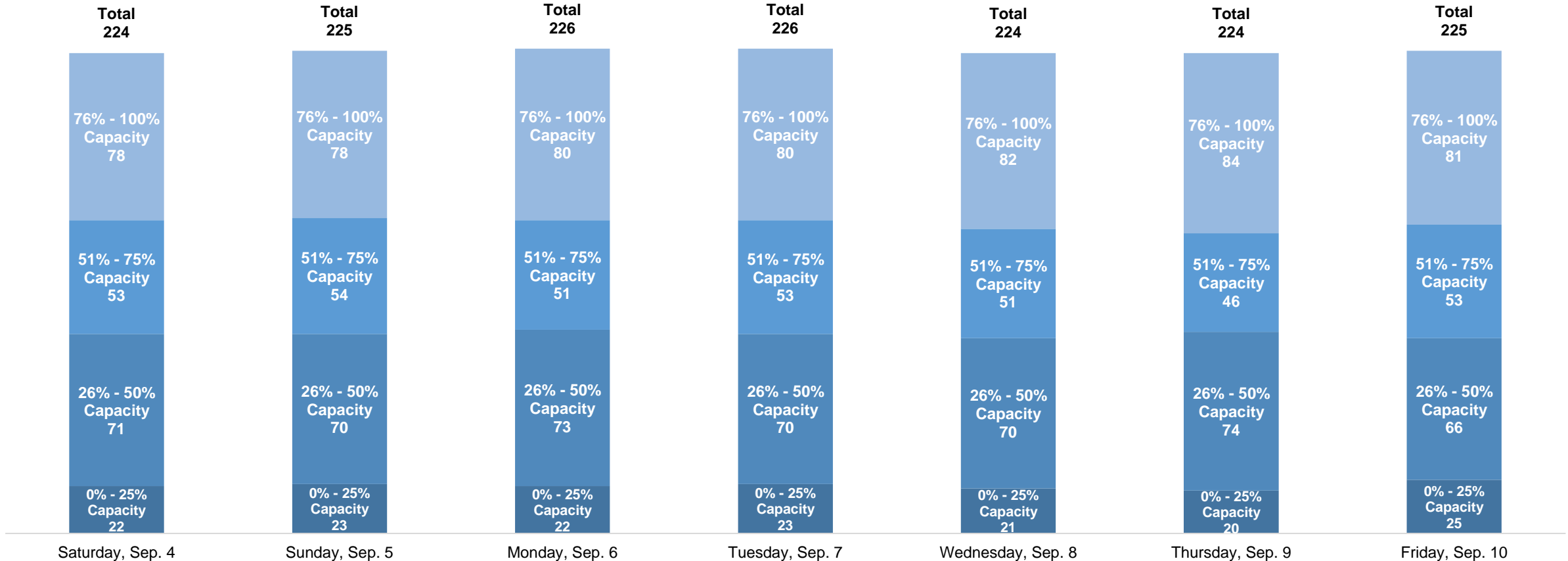
