

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









Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 October 24 - October 30, 2020




Number of Currently Incarcerated Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 March 17 - October 30, 2020










Number of People In Confirmed/Symptomatic Housing, March 16 - October 30, 2020




Percentage of People in Custody in Housing Areas with a COVID-19 Designation




Number and Percent of Open Units Above and Below 50% Capacity by Housing Category October 29, 2020
