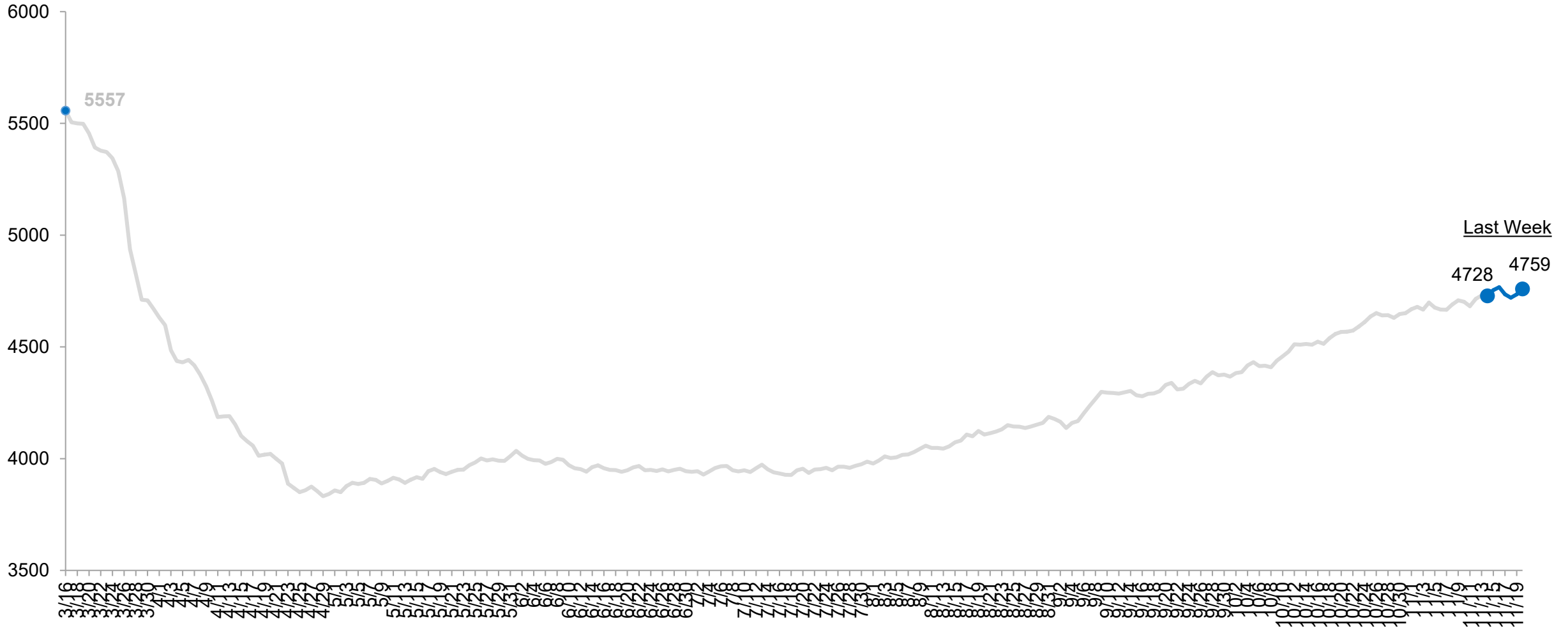

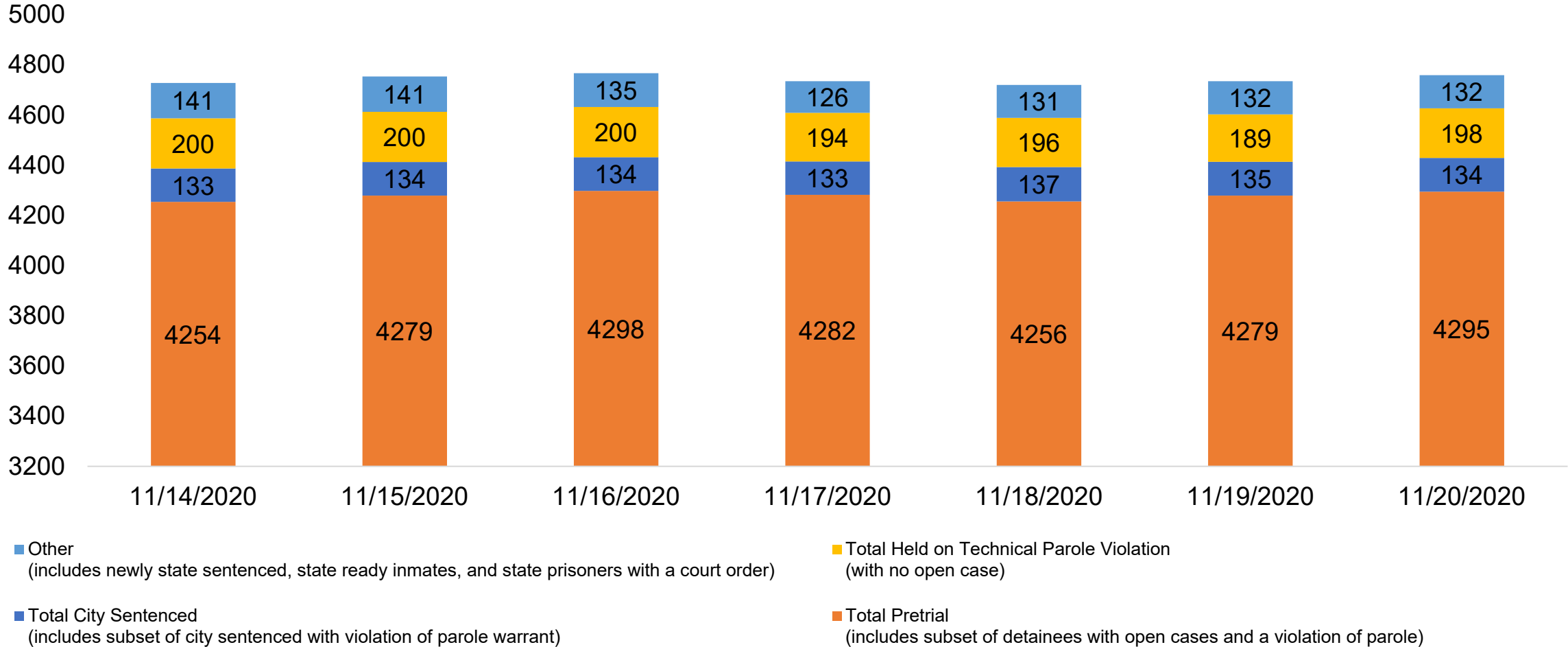
## Total Population in DOC Custody March 16 – November 20, 2020

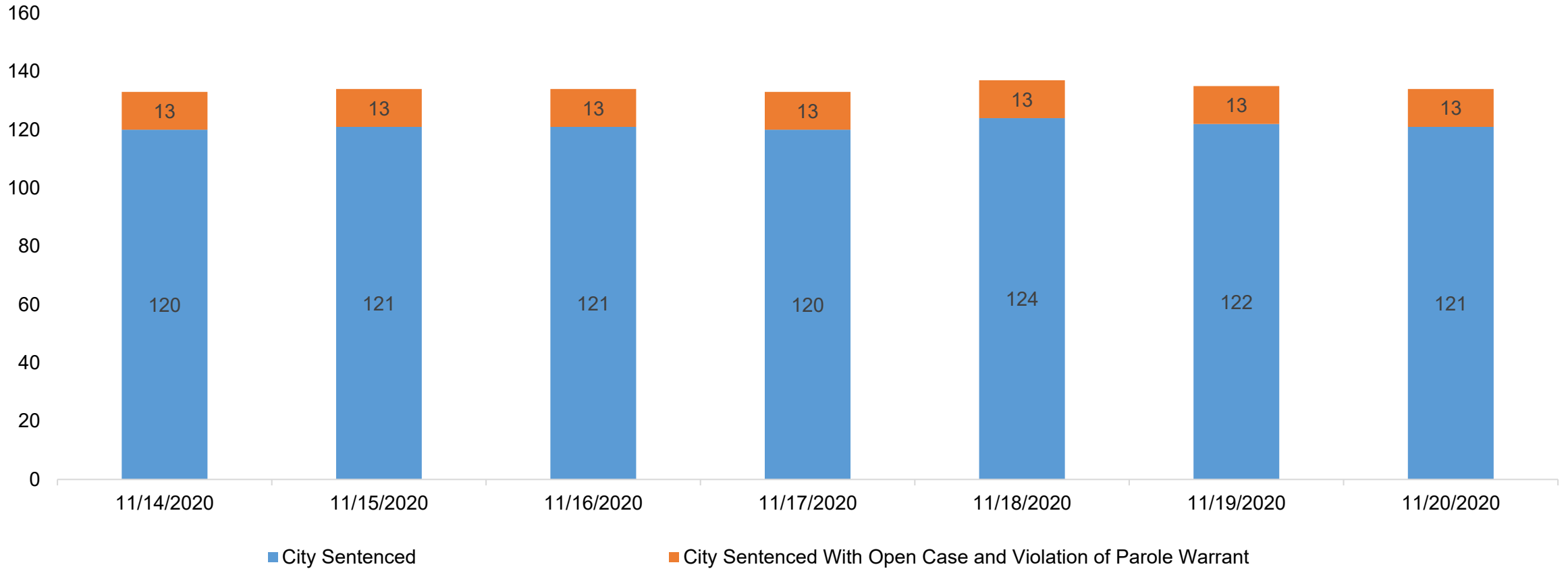

## Total DOC Population by Custody Status, 11/14/2020-11/20/2020



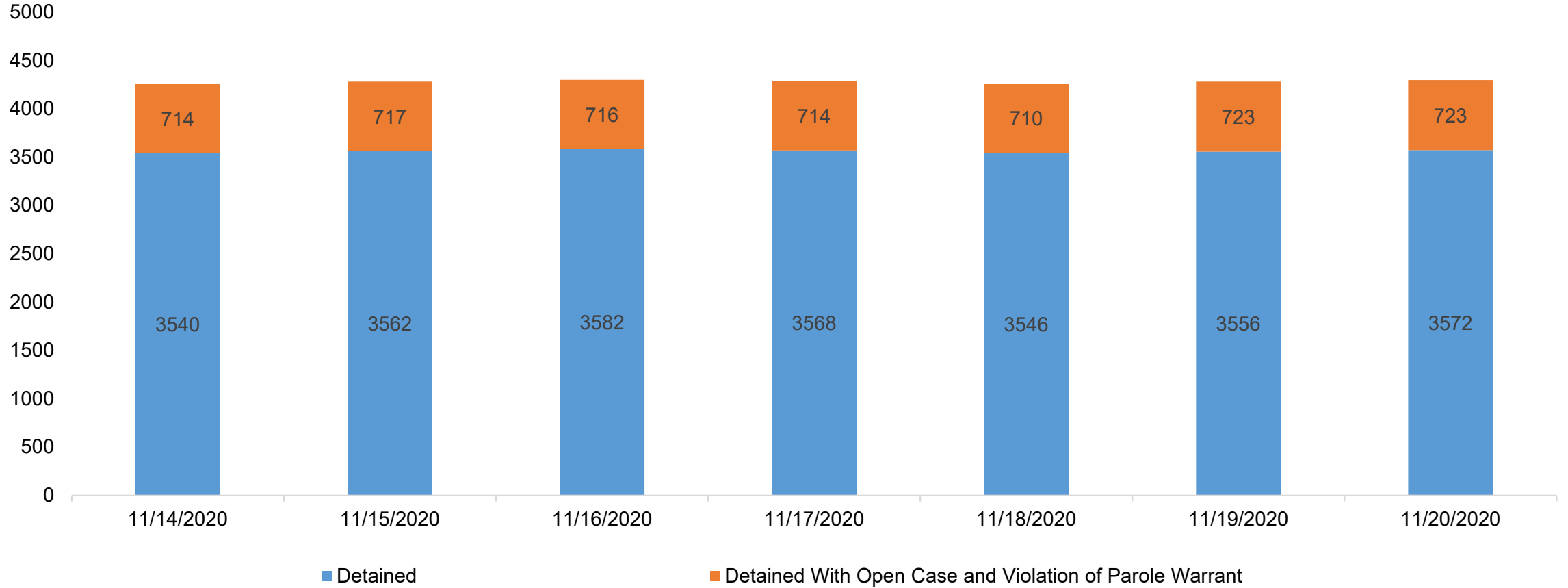

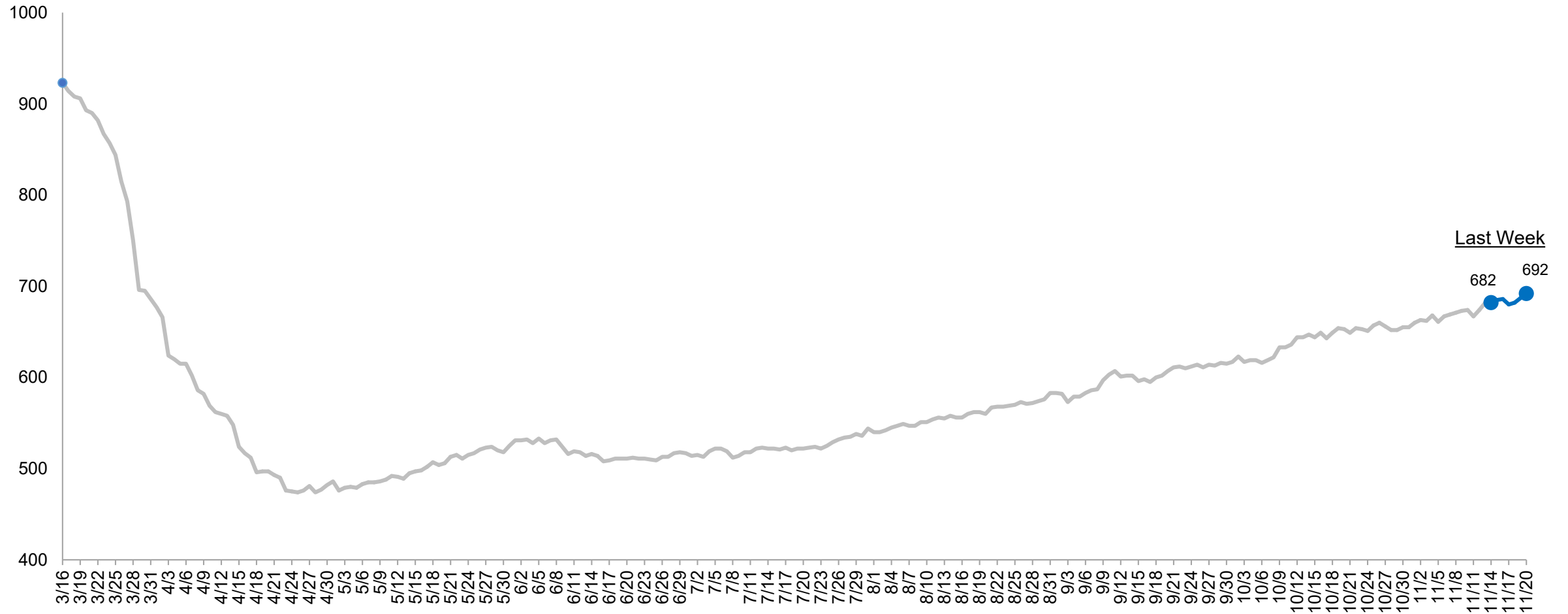

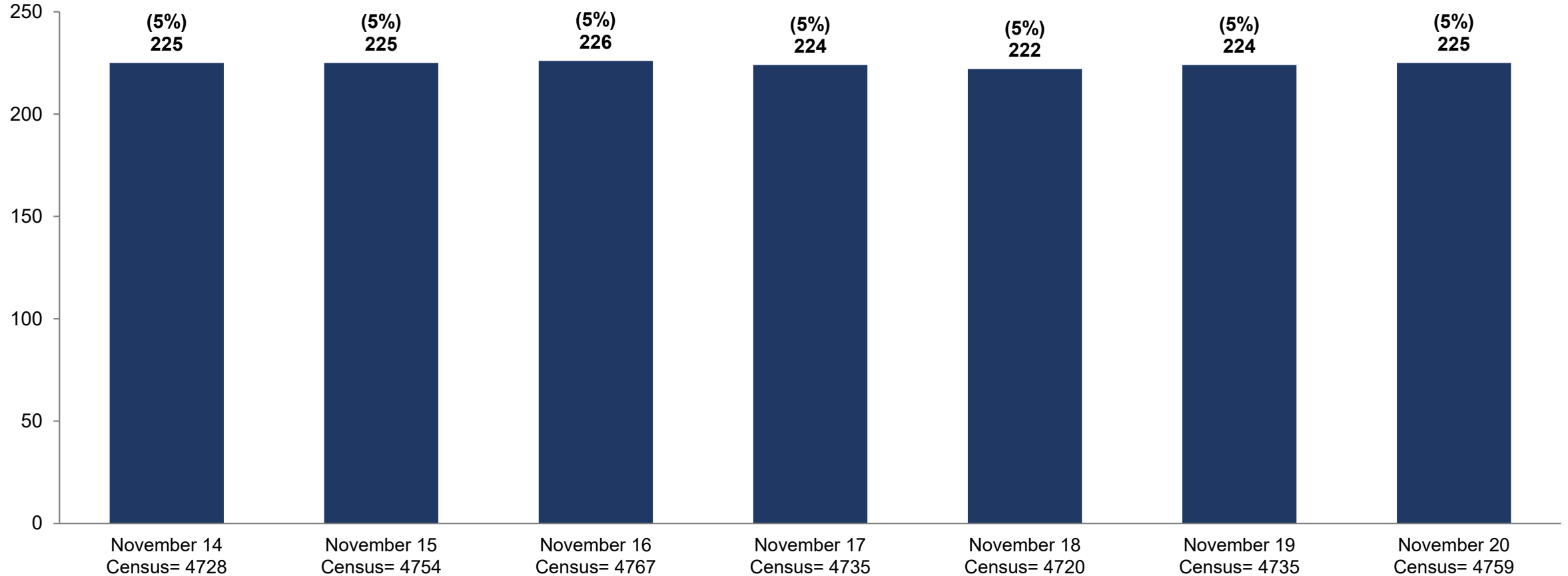

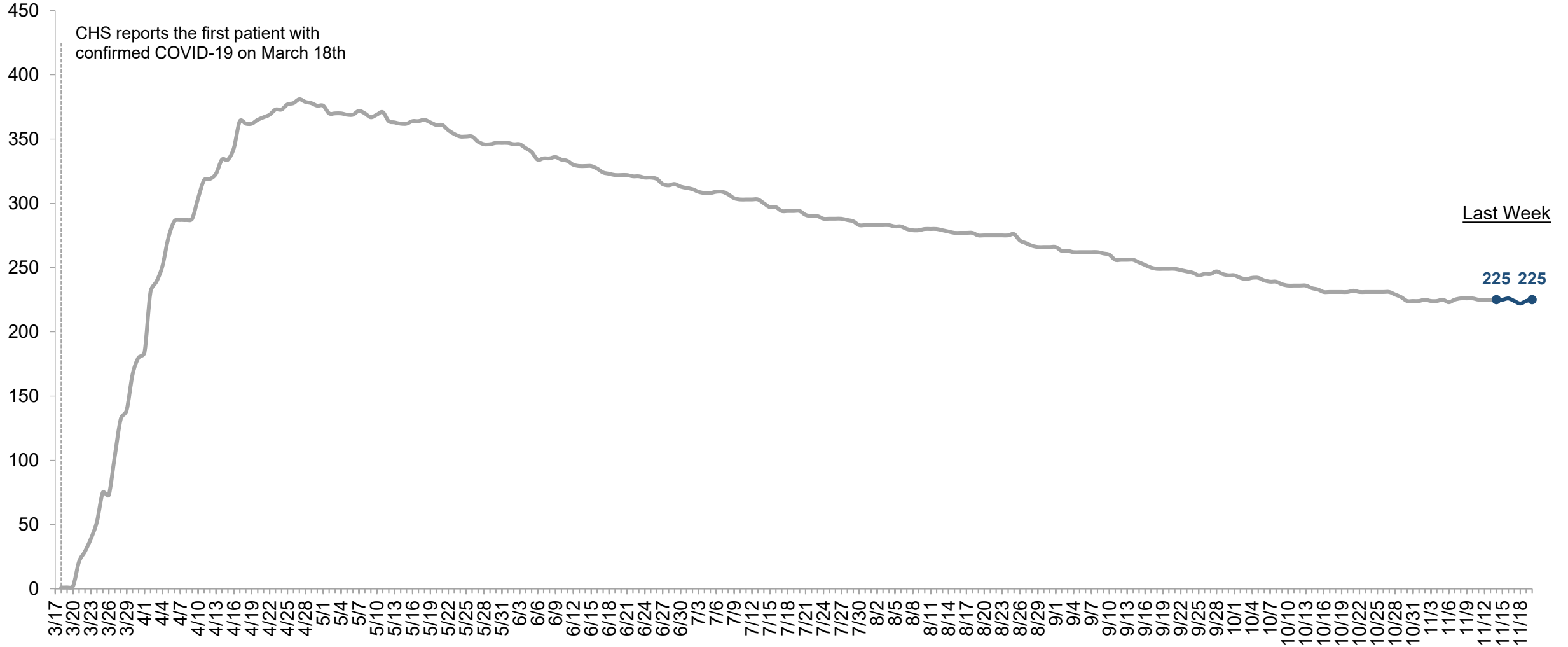
Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19

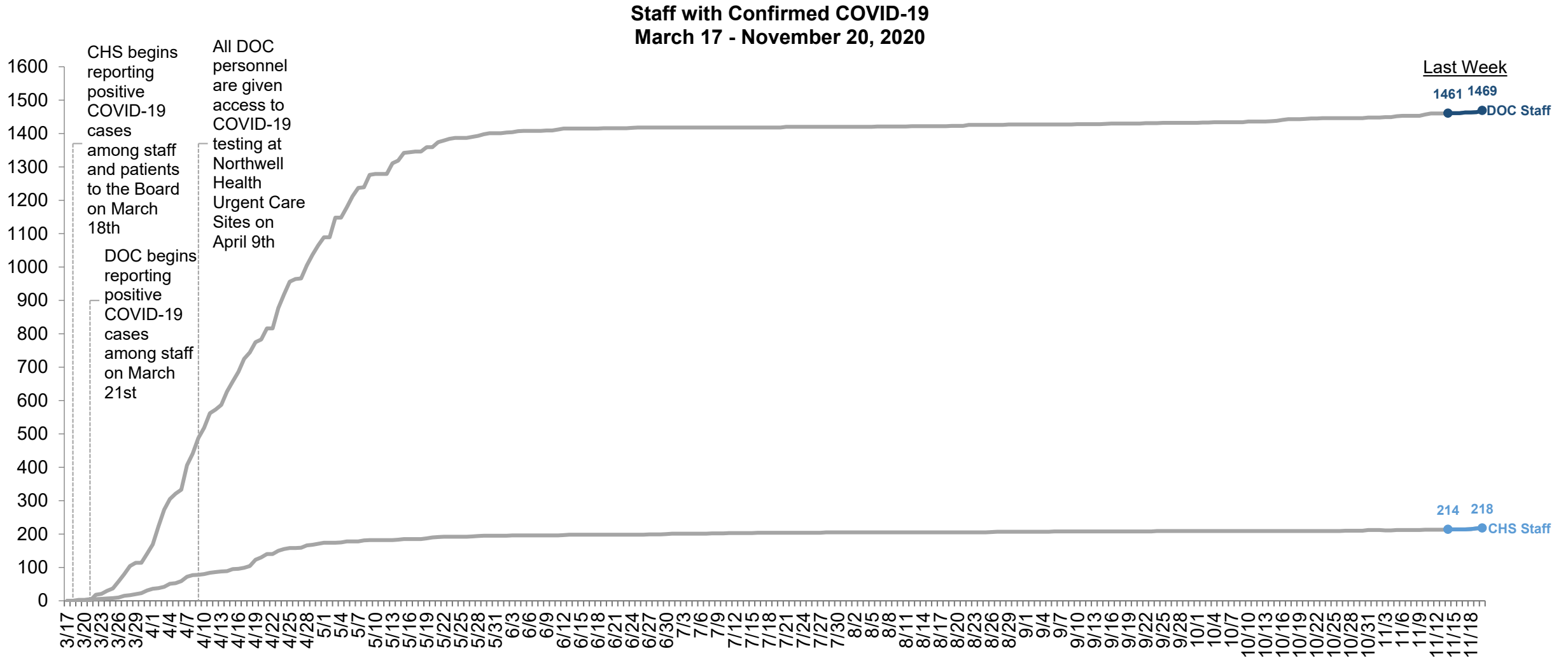

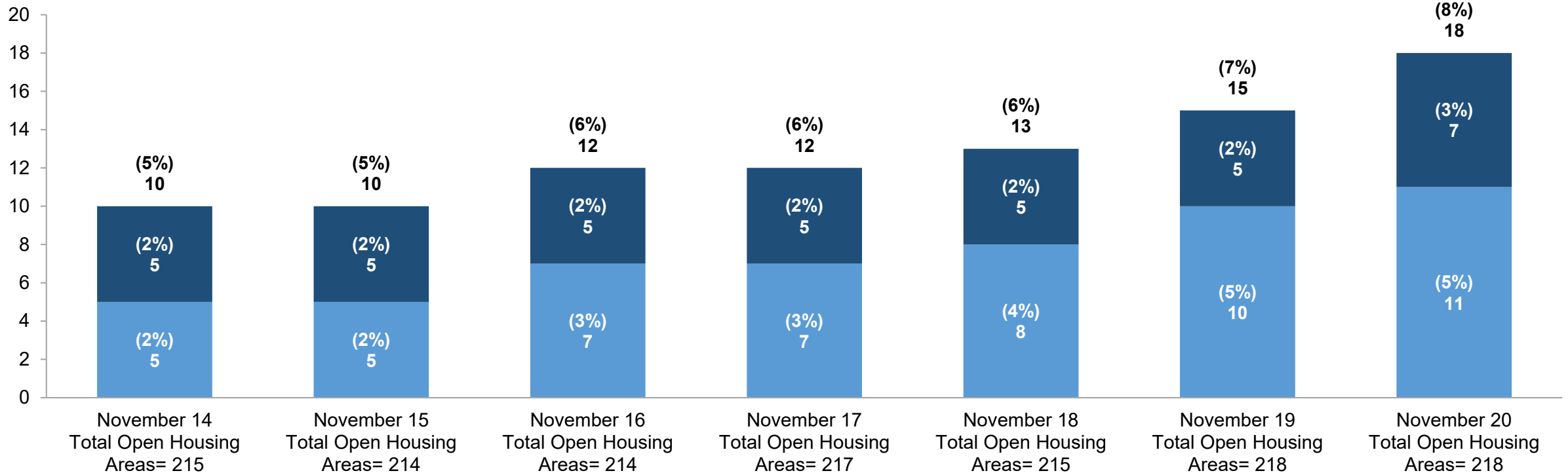

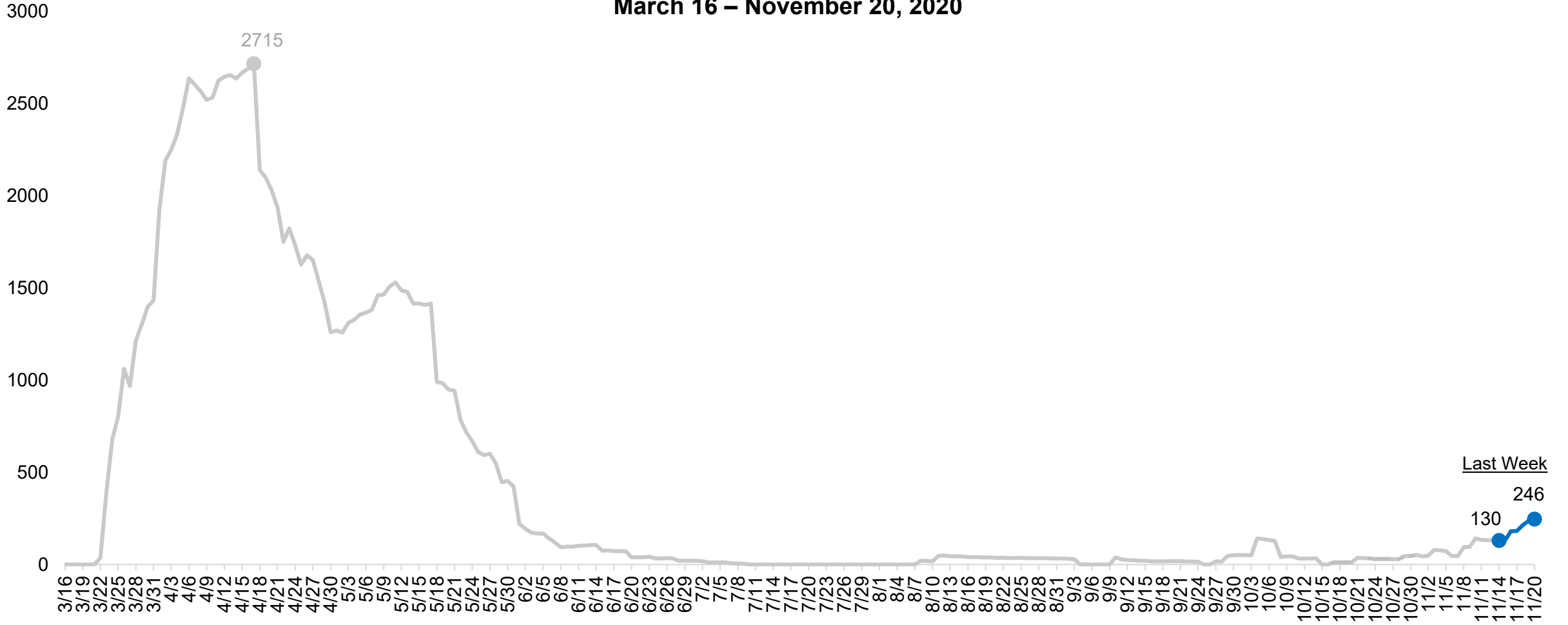

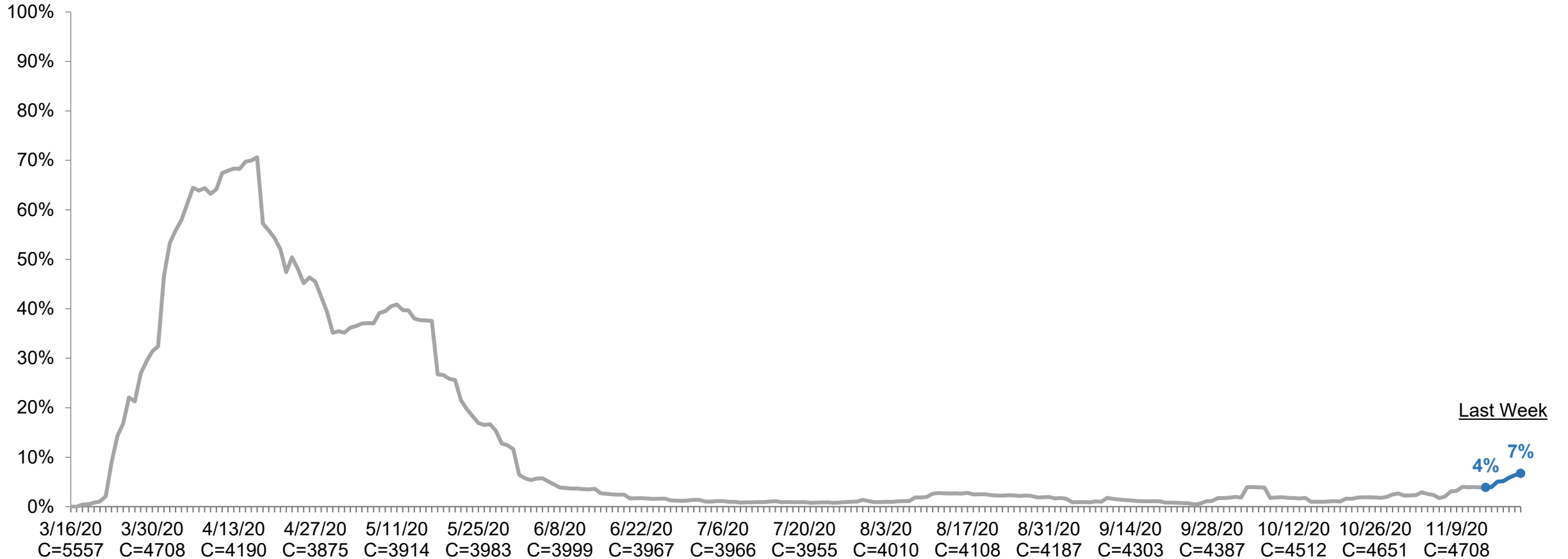

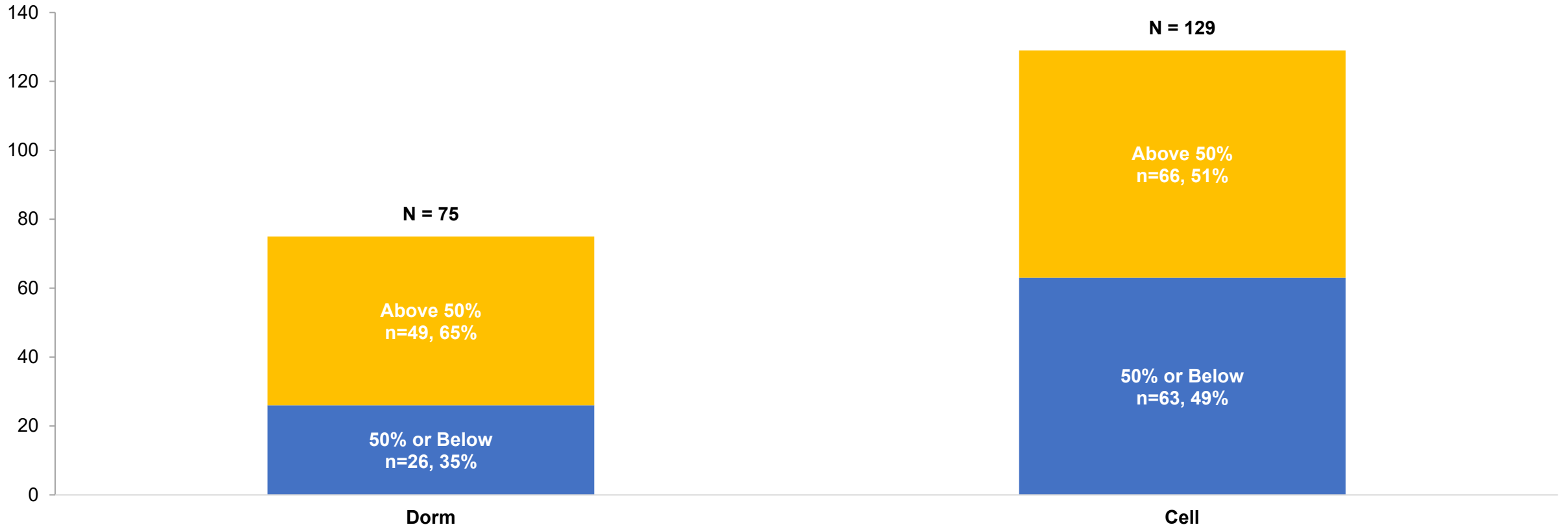

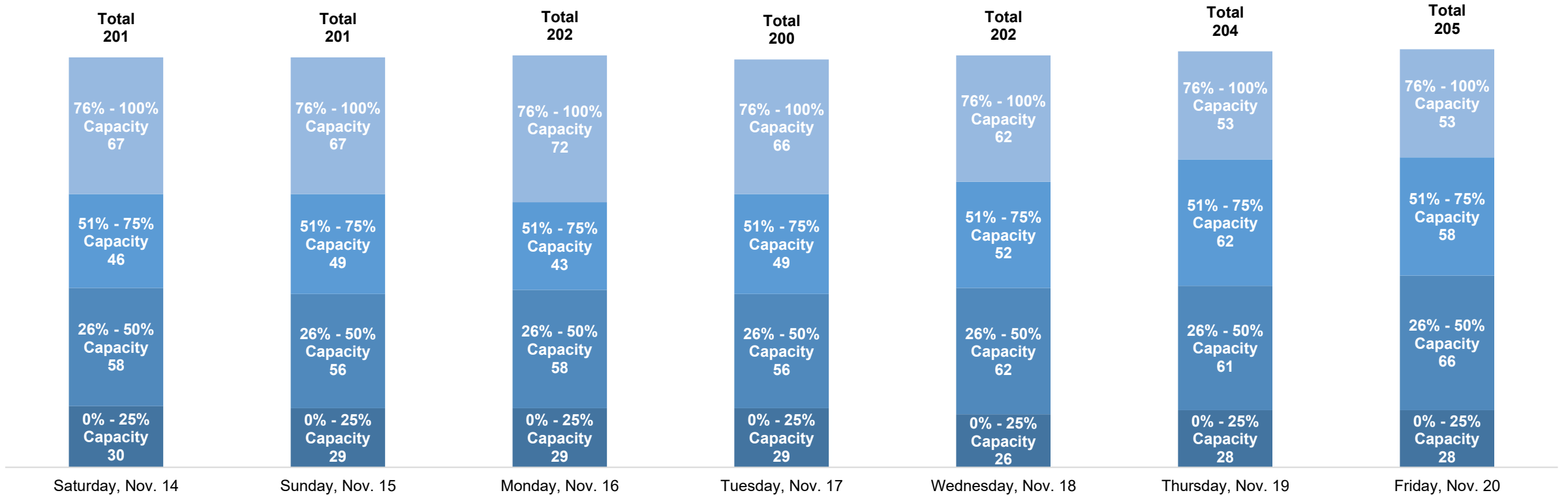
