




I. Population Change: DOC Population by Custody Status

Total DOC Population by Custody Status, 3/27/2021 - 4/2/2021












Number and Percent of Patients with Confirmed COVID-19 March 27 – April 2, 2021








III. Housing: People in Likely Exposed but Asymptomatic Housing¹








