The overall goal is 30% for the design phase and 30% for the construction phase, with a

breakdown requirement of 10% Black American, 10% Hispanic American, and 10% unspecified.

Within that 10% unspecified participation, this can be any ethnicity SBS or state certified M/WBE firms, including the WBE.

6) Could you please elaborate on the regulatory agencies that oversee the operations of the NYC DDC?

For the BBJ projects, DDC interfaces with and secures approvals from various agencies including

DOB, DEP, and DOT. We also must interface with SCLC, which is a state corrections commission.

DDC also deals with PDC for city planning and in securing approvals.
