Rep. #### **Election Dates**

Here are some key dates to keep in mind ahead of the upcoming election:

- Saturday, October 26th to Sunday, November 3rd: During this period, you can vote early. Find your early voting site and hours.
- Saturday, October 26th: This is the last day for the Board of Elections to receive an application for an early mail ballot, absentee ballot, and voter registration form by mail, online portal, email, or fax. This is also the last day you can have a voter registration application received by the Board of Elections by mail or in person. Find your borough Board of Elections office.
- **Monday, November 4th:** This is the last day to apply in person at your Board of Elections office for Early Mail Ballots and Absentee Ballots.
- **Tuesday, November 5th:**Election Day! Polls are open from 6am to 9pm that day. Find your poll site <u>here</u>.
- **Tuesday, November 5th:** This is the last day to postmark your early mail ballot and absentee ballot return envelope. It is also the last day to deliver a ballot in person at the Board of Elections or drop it off at a poll site.

#### NYC DOT Online Information on Parking Regulations

#### Expanded EmPower+ Program



EmPower+ helps low- and moderate-income households save energy and money toward energy improvements made to their primary residence. No-cost direct install improvements identified during the assessment can be installed by participating program contractors.

Funding toward the cost of energy efficiency improvements, including air sealing, insulation, heat pumps, heat pump water heaters, and electrical service and wiring upgrades is possible. Learn more and apply <u>HERE</u>.

### NYC's Cooling Assistance Program

NYC's Cooling Assistance program helps eligible New Yorkers afford air conditioning and fans during the hot summer months by covering costs of up to \$1,000 for new units or repairs to existing units. Many New Yorkers don't realize they qualify. Learn more <u>HERE</u>!

How to Tell Legal Cannabis Shops from Illegal Ones 1. All licensed dispensaries are issued a Dispensary Verification Tool which is posted in the storefront. Scan the QR code to be directed to OCM's website with a list of all licensed adult-use cannabis dispensaries.





2. When buying cannabis products, locate the Universal Symbol, which is pictured below. Every regulated adult-use cannabis product sold will also include the below New York State "universal symbol" designating it as a tested, regulated product. Consumers should check both the storefront for the Dispensary Verification Tool and the product label to ensure they're purchasing a regulated product. More examples of the "universal symbol" can be found <u>here</u>.



3. Check for a QR code or link to your product's "Certificate of Analysis" or CoA. All regulated products will have a QR code or link to that product's lab testing results called a Certificate of Analysis (CoA). All cannabis products must pass lab testing before being sold at licensed adult-use or medical dispensaries. Lab testing ensures cannabis products available are safer to consume and are accurately labeled with potency.

If you visit a cannabis shop that does not have all three of these, report the shop to Community Board 3.

### **Upcoming Opportunities**

#### **BID Formation Grants**

**Who should apply:** Community-based organizations who are already working toward BID formation; have a formal steering committee and have conducted a needs assessment survey; have been engaged with SBS already

**BID Formation Grants** are available to place-based community-based development organizations (CBDOs) that are currently working with a formal steering committee that has completed and analyzed needs assessment survey data.

- Applicants may be in the planning, outreach, or legislative phases of the BID formation process <u>outlined here</u>
- Up to \$100,000 per year per neighborhood will be awarded to grantees for the staffing, planning, and implementation of a BID formation proposal.

Applications Open for Business Preparedness and Resiliency Program Risk Assessment and Grant Program

If your business is at risk of flooding from storms, you may be eligible for the City's Risk Assessment and Grant Program. Through this program, eligible businesses can get a review of their physical location, business operations, and insurance needs so that they can get personalized recommendations on how to protect the business in the event of disasters. Furthermore, eligible participants can get grants of up to \$5,000 to help cover the costs of implementing recommendations.

Residential Trash Containerization Requirements Will Take Effect

November 12th

The Department of Sanitation is advising property owners and managers that beginning November 12, 2024, all trash must be set out in a bin (55 gallons or less) with a secure lid. This Rule will apply to:

- single-family homes
- two-family homes
- buildings with up to 9 apartments

Initially you may use a compliant bin (55 gallons or less with a secure lid) that you already have, but starting June 2026, you MUST use an Official NYC Bin. To learn more, please download the flyer <u>here</u> or visit the DSNY website <u>here</u>.
