- 1. For 1990, the time period of 1980 to 1989 includes data for January through March 1990.
- 2. More inclusive lists of country of birth, language spoken at home, and ancestry in 2000 are available on the Department of City Planning website under Socioeconomic Tables, Social Characteristics.
- 3. In 1990 (in contrast to 2000), nonresponse on country or region of birth was not allocated and 130,882 persons are included in the category "Not reported or born at sea," which is not shown. In 2000, 39 persons are reported "Born at sea."
- 4. In 1990, Russia and Ukraine were part of the Soviet Union. In 2000, totals for both Asia and Europe include countries that were formerly part of the Soviet Union.
- For 1990, the numbers for persons born in Bangladesh and persons who speak Hebrew or an African language are derived from the 1990 5 Percent Public Use Microdata Sample (PUMS) file. These data are not available at the Community District level.
- 6. Indic language includes Gujarathi, Hindi, Urdu, among others.
- 7. English-speaking proficiency of those persons who speak a foreign language at home was classified as those who speak English "very well," "well," "not well," or "not at all." The sum of the last three categories is shown in the Profiles as 'Does not speak English "very well."
- 8. Individuals may report more than one ancestry. The data represent a combination of up to two ancestries for each respondent. Thus, the sum of the percentages may exceed 100 percent. French includes Alsatian. Irish includes Celtic.
- 9. Lived elsewhere includes Puerto Rico, U.S. territories, and foreign countries.
- School enrollment data for 1990 and 2000 are not fully comparable due to changes in the instructions for questions on level of enrollment.
- 11. The unemployment rate is defined as the percent of the civilian labor force that is unemployed.
- 12. The 1990 categories for occupation and industry underwent major revision for 2000. For 1990 to 2000 comparisons using 2000 occupation and industry category definitions, 1990 categories are reclassified based on the Census Bureau Preliminary Occupation and Industry Tabulation Crosswalks. These comparisons are not available at the Community District level.
- 13. Workers 16 years and over are persons who were employed and at work during the calendar week prior to the date on which respondents completed their questionnaires or were interviewed by enumerators.
- 14. 1989 income distributions for New York City and boroughs were created using the 1990 5 Percent PUMS file. Dollar amounts used for these distributions are in 1999 constant dollars, based on the change in the Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index (CPI-U-RS) for the 1989-1999 period. These distributions are not available at the Community District level.
- 15. Households may have income from more than one source. Since the categories are percentaged on total households, the sum of the percentages may exceed 100 percent. In 1990, self-employment income excludes farm self-employment income and the public assistance income category includes Supplemental Security Income.
- 16. For 1990, housing data are from the full count STF1 files and totals may differ slightly from sample count STF3 housing data.
- 17. For 2000, housing data on occupancy and tenure are from the sample count SF3 file and may differ from housing data presented in the 1990-2000 Demographic Profile.
- 18. Other housing units include houseboats, railroad cars, mobile homes, vans, campers and trailers.
- 19. Data on Year Structure Built are more susceptible to errors of response and nonreporting because respondents must rely on their memory or estimates by people who have lived in the neighborhood a long time. With this limitation, the 2000 data provide a broad overview of building age.

- 20. Households by year householder moved into unit is not valid as a measure of change over time. It is more useful as an indicator of duration of residence at the time of enumeration.
- 21. Specified renter-occupied units include all renter-occupied units except 1-unit attached or detached houses on 10 acres or more.
- 22. Specified owner-occupied units are one family houses on less than 10 acres without a business or medical office on the property. Mobile homes are excluded.
