DVS Celebrates Hispanic Heritage Month



Statement from Commissioner James Hendon

Hispanic American Heritage month is a time for us as Americans to pause and recognize the cultures and traditions of our Hispanic and Latinx peoples. It is a time to celebrate those cultures and traditions that continually shape our great nation. It is the realization that Hispanic and Latinx Americans are not a monolith, but a diverse and dynamic people whose stories are a fundamental part of the American identity.

In honoring the great accomplishments of the Hispanic and Latinx communities, it is critical to remember those who not only emigrated to this country, but who —for generations—proudly served this nation in uniform. Hispanic and Latinx peoples comprise approximately 7% of the US Veteran population, 16% of all Active Duty Military Personnel, and 21% of New York City's Veteran community. They consist of heroes like Cresencia "Joyce" Garcia, an Afro Puerto Rican woman who served in the US Army during World War II. Born in Maunabo, Puerto Rico, Garcia moved to New York City prior to enlisting in the military at age 24. She served as a medical assistant, working in a burn unit while assigned to the all-Black female Six Triple Eight Battalion, deploying to Europe in 1945. Garcia felt called to serve after the attack on Pearl Harbor, saying, "All the girls were going to the Army, so I said, 'Why can't I?' So I joined."

"Why can't I?" is a sentiment that is echoed throughout the Hispanic and Latinx experience nationwide. That sentiment fuels an ongoing determination within these communities to build and protect the United States—in past, present, and future times. It is our undertaking as citizens to ensure that Hispanic and Latinx

peoples are honored and remembered for their contributions to every facet of American life, including their contribution to our nation's defense.

This month, we celebrate the generations of Hispanic and Latinx leaders, thinkers, artists, military heroes, and others who came to this land in search of opportunity and devoted themselves to help us collectively form a more perfect union. America is better because of their sacrifice. We at the NYC Department of Veterans' Services wish to particularly acknowledge those Hispanic and Latinx peoples whose sacrifice was embodied in military service—to those Service Members and their families. Thank you.



Founded on September 29, 1899, by Spanish-American War Veteran James C. Putnam, the VFW has since grown into some six thousand posts worldwide and 52 departments in the 50 states offering services and advocacy to Veterans and their families. Today, the VFW boasts more than 1.5 million members.

The VFW serves Veterans, military families, and those still serving through advocacy, lobbying work, and military and community service programs. As a Veterans service organization, the VFW focuses lobbying, awareness raising, and outreach efforts on an array of issues facing Veterans, servicemembers, and their families, including:

- education, employment, and transition assistance
- · military quality of life.
